
Development

Grants can be a valuable aid whether you're beginning a project from the ground up or seeking assistance to meet your fundraising goal, as they offer excellent support for your sensory initiative.

Government Grants

The UK and devolved governments offer various types of grants to schools for different purposes, including a sensory environment. In England, these grants are typically made available through the DfE or the Education and Skills Funding Agency.

The grants available depend on factors such as the type of school, location, and its size. There are grants available specifically for SEND Schools or those located in disadvantaged areas.

Rompa[®] recommends contacting your local authority or the DfE to see if there are any grants suitable and / or available for your school.

Foyle Foundation

The Foyle Foundation awards grants to schools to support learning and the aquisition of knowledge.

Wooden Spoon supports projects that improve the quality of life for children and young people who are disadvantaged physically, mentally or socially.

The charity has previously provided funding for schools towards soft play rooms, sensory gardens, sensory rooms and hydrotherapy/swimming pools.

Other Funding Options

If you do not want to pursue the grant route for funding, here are a few more suggestions on funding options:

- Fundraising this could be anything from a bake sale to a sponsored walk.
- Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) some companies have programmes that provide funding or support to community projects. Care homes can approach local businesses to see if they would be willing to support the creation of a sensory environment
- Crowdfunding creating a crowdfunding campaign to raise money. Websites such as GoFundMe, Kickstarter, and Crowdfunder allow people to donate money to support projects.
